GENERAL GUIDELINES

The Conference Committee welcomes submissions of original works to be performed during the conference. Works under 10 minutes for solo instruments, one or two pianos (two or more hands), small ensembles, voice, tape works or works with electronic accompaniment will be considered.

For electronic music, and non-Western instruments, composers must either perform their own works or provide their own performer(s). The conference organisers will try to find performers for submitted works, but it is highly recommended that composers provide their own performers. (Works utilising electronic media will be considered contingent upon the availability of technological resources on site; performers must provide their own computer or tablet and interface for any needed audio or video playback.) Composers are strongly encouraged to attend the performance.

Please submit this Google form with the following information:

- The names, pronouns, email addresses, and institutional affiliations of all proposers and/or collaborators.
- The composition's title, instrumentation, and duration.
- Brief biography of the composer (not to exceed 150 words).
- Abstract or programme notes (not to exceed 250 words).
- CV/Resumé of the proposer
- PDF copy of the full score and individual parts as **one** PDF file. Please make sure the scores and parts are fully anonymised. For works that are not represented in a traditional score-and-parts format, please provide a description of the conceptual framework used in the realisation of the composition.
- Audio/MIDI Example
- List of required equipment (this includes chairs, stands, electronics, etc.)
- Confirmation of whether or not the composer can provide performers

By submitting to this call, the speaker gives permission to ACMI for the presentation to be recorded and broadcast live.
